Direct messaging Functionality (b)(1)/(b)(2) (§§170.314) Transitions of Care – Receive, Display, Incorporate / Create and Transmit e1. View, Download, and Transit	This functionality allows users to send and receive Direct-based messages to/from other users of certified health IT systems. Direct messages may include clinical data, notes, and other information, subject to the limitations noted.	Direct-based messaging requires organizations to contract with either our preferred HISP provider, MAXMD, or with any other independent HISP provider or HIE providing HISP services. HISP providers usually charge a one-time setup fee and annual subscriptions for each “Direct” address acquired. ProComp will also charge a one-time setup fee to connect to a HISP provider.	Users are not required or contractually bound to use our preferred HISP services provider. Direct-based messaging will require that the organization contract and maintain subscriptions with a HISP services provider and complete a trust agreement with that HISP provider.	Users may only exchange Direct messages within a single trust network. This may either be our preferred HISP vendor MAXMD or any other HISP provider’s network with whom a trust agreement is established. The particular HISP services provider chosen by the organization may impose other limitations such as frequency and volume of messages (though these restrictions are rare with independent HISP providers).
Electronic ePrescribing (b)(3) (§§170.314)	This functionality allows physicians and DEA licensed APNs and PAs to send electronic prescriptions to pharmacies.	This functionality requires the use of DigitalRx, a web based ePrescribe application. Fees for integration of this functionality and annual subscriptions for each prescriber are included in the general purchase costs and annual maintenance fees for our CattRx EHR product. The only additional fees include a \$125 onboarding fee for those prescribers who wish to send controlled medication prescriptions electronically to pharmacies to cover the cost of DEA mandated “ID Proofing” and the “OTP” device for two factor authentication.	No contractual limitations.	No technical or practical limitations.
Incorporate Lab Results (b)(5) (§§170.314)	This functionality allows direct real-time interfacing with HIEs(Health Information Exchange) and commercial Lab companies to download clinical lab results directly into the EHR.	A one-time setup and configuration fee as well as an annual maintenance fee will be charged for each HL7 interface to HIEs. If an organization requires an interface to commercial lab vendors requiring specific certification, ProComp reserves the right to assess fees to cover these costs. HIEs may also require their own annual subscription fees for each physician (MD, APN, PA) employed by the organization.	No contractual limitations.	There are no technical or practical limitations imposed by Procomp in interfacing with public HIEs for receiving electronic lab results. Commercial lab vendors may require certain capabilities as a precondition to interfacing with an EHR that ProComp’s HL7 interface may not be able to comply with.
Transmission to Immunization Registries and Public Health Agencies (f)(2)/(f)(3) (§§170.314)	This functionality provides direct submission of electronic immunization data and electronic syndromic surveillance data to public health registries.	A one-time setup and configuration fee as well as an annual maintenance fee will be charged for each interface to public health registries.	No contractual limitations.	There are no technical or practical limitations imposed by Procomp in interfacing with public registries to submit data. Local public health registries may impose their own limitations.
CQM Measures c(1)/(c)(2)/(c)(3) (§§170.314) Capture and Export/Import and Calculate/Electronic Submission	This functionality calculates Clinical Quality Measures and aggregates measures into reporting files for electronic submission.	ProComp provides the following nine CQM measures without additional fees: CMS068v3; CMS069v2; CMS117v2; CMS127v2; CMS138v2; CMS147v2; CMS155v2; CMS165v2; CMS177v2. A one- time installation/configuration fee will be charged for each additional CQM requested.	No contractual limitations.	No technical or practical limitations.
